Chamber music is music for a small group of musicians (usually 3-6) where every player has his or her own part. Each player takes on a leadership role as every part is of equal importance. There is no conductor so chamber ensemble players work together to make their own musical decisions. Playing in a chamber ensemble with friends and like-minded musicians nurtures outstanding musicianship and is one of the most enjoyable and rewarding activities that every musician should experience.

As a bridge between solo and orchestral playing, chamber music develops unique musical and social skills:

- Listening –matching sound quality, pitch, rhythm and articulation
- Communication skills, visual and verbal
- Leadership, self-discipline and independence
- Sharing expression and stylistic interpretation
- Extensive repertoire knowledge
- HSC ensemble preparation
- Gigs weddings, events, busking

Chamber ensembles are made of combinations of instruments - usually orchestral strings, woodwinds and brass, recorders, guitar and/or piano. Some standard ensemble combinations are:

2017 Chamber Ensemble Program

- 4 concerts, one each term

Chamber Ensemble Requirements

- Students MUST complete the new 2017 Enrolment & Payment form by no later than Friday 27 January.
- Students of NECOM, Music Educator Members or private teachers may enrol in this program.
- Minimum standard is AMEB Grade 3/Trinity Grade 4 for orchestral strings, woodwinds, piano, harp, guitar and recorder.
- An Ensemble already established in a school or with friends may enrol.
- Individual students may apply and NECOM will endeavour to create an ensemble with other suitable players/instruments and level. If this is no possible applicants are placed on a waiting list OR fees will be refunded.
- The success of the ensemble depends on reliability and commitment to attend all dates listed.

This is an important summary of our Enrolment Policy. Please read carefully and file for future reference.

Enrolment Terms & Conditions

- Programs are designed for the full year of sequential activities and it is assumed that enrolment is for the full year unless cancellation in writing is received 4 weeks before the start of each term (refer to 'Cancellation of Enrolment' details below).
- To activate enrolment, all students MUST complete the new 2017 Enrolment & Payment form. 2.
- After the 2017 enrolment is processed, invoices for Terms 2, 3 and 4 will be sent automatically 4 weeks before each term. 3.
- It is the responsibility of the Account Holder to notify the NECOM Office of any changes to their contact addresses and student enrolment details as soon as these details change.
- NECOM reserves the right to suspend/cancel enrolments if accounts are outstanding (non-defaulting payment plans excluded).
- 6. Accounts that remain unpaid are sent to appropriate agents for recovery. If recovery/legal action is undertaken, the Account Holder (parents/guardians/student) will be responsible for all expenses in relation to the collection of the out-standing amount including, but not limited to, all charges and fees, legal costs on an indemnity basis, and disbursements.
- 7. NECOM may take and use photographs or videos of activities for promotional and archival purposes.
- Relevant NECOM policies and directions apply to adult students/parents/guardians/students. These policies may be varied at times by NECOM and up to date copies can be obtained upon request to NECOM.

Tutorial Attendance Policy: Terms & Conditions

Late Commencements, Missed Tutorials & Refunds

- New students who enrol after the beginning of the term will be given a pro-rata reduction in tuition fees.
- Tutorials missed will NOT receive a refund under any circumstances.
- In exceptional circumstances (e.g. serious prolonged illness or accident with a doctor's certificate), a request for credit or a refund must be made in writing by post or email (admin@necom.org.au) to NECOM.
- An administration fee of \$25 will apply if a credit or refund is approved due to exceptional circumstances.

Cancellation of Enrolment & Withdrawal from program

- Programs are designed for the full year of sequential activities and it is assumed that enrolment is for the full year.
- If you decide to stop having lessons, you must cancel your enrolment and withdraw from the annual program.
- To cancel your enrolment you must:
 - Notify NECOM office in writing (mail or email admin@necom.org.au) at least 4 weeks before the start of each term.
- If you do not cancel your enrolment, you will be automatically invoiced for your continuing enrolment and must pay the term fee.
- A telephone call, text or casual conversation with your teacher does not constitute an official written notification to NECOM administration of your cancellation of enrolment.
- Failure to attend lessons does not constitute cancellation, withdrawal or deferment and fees will remain payable.
- If you forget or fail to give written notice to cancel your enrolment before the first week of the term, you will be liable to pay the full term fee as NECOM has contracted the teacher and booked the timeslot to deliver those lessons to the student.
- An administration fee of \$25 will apply if a credit or refund is approved.
